Implementation

We deliver our PSHE, RSE and Wellbeing curriculum in 3 ways:

Stage 1: Our planned curriculum

All classes have the flexibility to add "circle time" activities specific to any class, local or national needs.

This means there is ongoing personalisation.

The long-term planning is based on the Dimensions 3D PSHE curriculum. It is progressive over the different year groups and spirals to embed three core themes:

- > Health and Wellbeing
- > Relationships
- > Living in the Wider World

We have personalised the curriculum further adding planed lessons to cover 'extremism and radicalisation' and 'British Values' We also have planned Relationship and Sex Education lesson which cover the units:

> Families and people that care for me

- > Caring Friendships
- > Respectful Relationships
- > Online Relationships
- > Being Safe
- > Sex Education

(Our RSE curriculum was consulted on with parents in 2019).

Whilst our long-term planning lists lessons in core themes they often overlap.

Online Relationships and e-safety are also taught throughout the Computing curriculum.

British Values are also taught cross curricular and in Collective Worship each week using the Picture

News Resources, which link British Values to current affairs.

Additional planned safety lessons: The school has a safety mascot, Safety Mouse, who gives a weekly safety message, these are often responsive to local and national needs, but there are also at least 6

planned safety elements covered with each term, see long term planning.

Stage 2: Character education , cultural capital and personal development

Complementing our planned curriculum are other ongoing elements linked to providing character education and support pupils personal development.

Reepham Rangers

Reepham Rangers is a badge based system (like Scouts) where pupils complete specific challenges to complete badges. These have been planned to enhance the National Curriculum, pupils Cultural Capital, Character Education, PSHE and Church Values.

Badges are available in the following areas:

- Resilience
- Social Action
- Teamwork
- Arts
- Our World

Additional Cultural Capital opportunities

Reepham school ensures Cultural Capital opportunities run throughout the curriculum, many are detailed in the Personal Development section above. On top of this, the school has:

> A planned "music genre" of the term where each class learns about a different musician, this is also linked to generating progressive debate opportunities in Class Collective Worships.

- > The school has a planned out Artist of the term with a linked competition
- > The school uses Picture News weekly for the children to understand global events.
- > Across our curriculum we ensure pupils see a range of art and artefacts from different cultural and time periods (such as in RE, History and Geography units).
- > We ensure trips are relevant and inspiring as well and we bring in a range of visitors.
- > We ensure we have intergenerational activities such as grandparents mornings, working with the local community and run village events such as Carols Around the Christmas tree so the young can learn and be inspired by a different generation.
- > One day a week the School Council runs a tuck shop in school to give children of all areas the experience of buying an item.
- > We ensure Personal Characteristic are celebrated and that traditionally underrepresented groups are a strategic focus within our curriculum: individual subjects have Celebrating Diversity opportunities within their long-term planning, characters in displays and worksheets, such as maths, come from a range of backgrounds and specific thought has been given to the representation of different groups within our class library's (see appendix 2).

The school also has an Everyone Is Awesome display where pupils can leave the headteacher notes on what makes us all awesome.

To aid social mobility we priorities vulnerable groups such as disadvantaged pupils and those with SEND to take part in these events, for example paying for trips and/or additional resources and giving priority spots in our lunch time clubs.

Stage 3: Tailored interventions

We offer interventions in two ways:

- 1: Pupil led/initiated pastoral interventions
- Pupils can use class Worry Monsters to book a 'time to talk slot"
- Pupils are told they may ask any adult for time to discuss anything
- Pupils can ask a "wellbeing warrior" (child who has a star badge) for advise
- Parents are also told to get in touch if they would like their child to access pastoral support
- 2: School Planned Pastoral interventions
- Pupils may have intervention planed through provision mapping or IEPs
- All disadvantaged pupil premium pupils have an individual profile that is created annual in discussion with their families
- Some pupils are identified by their teachers for short or longer term pastoral support
- The Stirling Wellbeing Scale is used to identify pupils needs
- Certain questions from The Stirling Wellbeing Scale are put into the annual pupil questionnaire to identify emerging needs (for individuals or cohorts) Planned session include:
- Time to talk session

- Lego Theory
- Cognitive Behaviour Session
- Think Good Feel Good sessions
- Social Stories
- Socially Speaking session
- Feelings Detectives
- Self Esteem Support
- Overcoming Anxiety

Key staff have had training in different areas including basic counselling, bereavement and mental health first aid. We also work with specific agencies when needed including: counsellors, specialist teaching teams

Safety Mascot - Safety Mouse: Additional Safety Sessions

To compliment the planned safety lessons, we also have a safety mascot, Safety Mouse, who delivers a weekly safety message to the pupils. The safety measures can be adapted to address local and/or national emerging needs, but there are also planned safety messages that will be covered annually. These include:
