Subject Intent: To best prepare children for the next stage in their learning journey, where all children can write, enjoy writing and not have writing as a barrier to learning and life experiences.

Past= To be at peace and ready to learn: A love of reading and writing is promoted from the beginning of a child's school journey through high quality modelling. We ensure lessons are accessible for all pupils through scaffolding and promote writing for purpose to inspire them to be authors.

Everyone is ready for the next stage. Pupils will be able to use their writing ability to express their viewpoints in an eloquent manner.
